Transport Carefully!

Household hazardous waste items have warning labels on them for a reason.
Before putting them in your vehicle, please take the following precautions:

- Keep products in their original containers when possible
- Make sure products are properly sealed to prevent leaks and spills
- If a container is leaking, put it into a secondary leak-proof container
- Do NOT mix products together dangerous reactions can occur when some chemicals are mixed
- Pack containers in sturdy boxes in the trunk of your vehicle, away from the driver, passengers and pets
- Cardboard boxes work well, but containers (other than gasoline cans) and boxes cannot be returned to you
- Please do NOT put items in plastic bags
- If a product does not have the original label, label it yourself if you are certain of the contents—this will help us ensure its proper disposal
- Always store products in a secure place, away from children, pets, sparks and flames
